## Trip Reports

### February Ski Trip to Michigan

We started out a day earlier than planned to catch the snow before it melted. It was a good plan. Sunday we got to the Cross Country Ski Headquarters at Higgins Lake where we were able to ski all the trails. Then from our comfy base in Grayling at Borchers's B&B canoe rental, we skied Hartwick Pines SP known for its 300 year old white pines and later the Mason Track Pathway along the Au Sable River.

With temperatures warming we headed north to Gaylord and skied along a lovely stream with signs of beaver activity at the Michaywe Resort complex as well as at Aspen Park where we saw elk in the distance. Both of these areas are surrounded by the city! Further north we stayed at Petoskey in a motel with a view of Little Traverse Bay. Wednesday with temperatures in the 50's we did a short hike in Harbor Springs, found the springs, and also some woodpeckers. The afternoon found us shopping for Petoskey stones and gently used winter equipment and apparel.

Cooler temperatures on Thursday allowed us to ski in a nature preserve near Good Hart. The snow was wet and coming down furiously. The snow covered everything including us. Shrouded in fog and snow we could only marvel at the beauty and quiet. Less than two miles away, we found out later, there was no snow fall! For a future trip to the Petoskey area we recommend the Wildwood Pathway. We tried to ski it, but there was not enough new snow.

So reluctantly Friday we headed south and stopped at the Shingle Mill Pathway along the Pigeon River. The pathway was icy and not the best for either skis or snowshoes. We ended the day with a hike along the southern end of the Mason Track looking for a bald eagle that had been spotted there. We skied in condition from good snow to icy (a.k.a skating with poles) to slushy, but think we did quite well for a week when the Midwest was setting record warm temperatures. We drove home with it snowing and temperatures dropping.

The Dayton Area Red Cross is sponsoring a Wilderness First Aid course. The cost is \$60 which is much cheaper than what other organizations are charging for the same training. The course description is:

Wilderness First Aid Basics is a 16-hour program that is designed for those who work, live, or play in remote areas such as rural areas, wilderness and back-country environments. This course contains the module "When Help is Delayed" and provides an excellent program for boaters, camp workers, scouts, hikers and other outdoor sports enthusiasts. Certificates: Wilderness First Aid and When Help is Delayed
